

Belmont School LONG TERM PLAN FOR The Arts KS3 2022-2023

CONTEXT & INTENT for Class:

All students to develop their communication and expressive skills by taking part in a range of creative and expressive activities. All students will develop a range of life skills including teamwork, confidence, self- expression and listening. Each set of skills can be tailored to the topic the class is covering and the stage of development. Learning is sequential and builds in levels of difficulty and skill to build towards to Arts Award Qualification which runs bi-annually in Key Stage 4.

Giraffes and Hippos	Ideas for Arts lessons based on 'Getting to know you': Connect: Listen to each others favourite songs – why do you like them? Describe your favourite part. Watch a film as a class and have a clas discussion about what each character is like. Then, use clay/plastercine to make models of the characters Create an inner and outer self portrait – ask pupils to draw a face shape (or print one off) and split the face in half. On one side think of their 'outside qualities' to write around the face, then fill the face with half	Ideas for arts lessons based around the Christmas concert: Connect: Watch clips from professional pantomimes on youtube. Discuss the storyline and characters Discuss why the acting is good and give examples Watch musical numbers and say what you saw Create: Rehearsing lines and working on voice – what kind of voice does your character have? How would they say that line? What are they thinking/feeling? 'Staging' the scene – where will you stand? Make a stage diagram and mark where props/set/people will be Make a poster to advertise the pantomime	Create an Exhibition (Based on your topic) Connect: Look at some artwork surrounding your topic – what is already out there? Are there any artists making art about your topic? Discuss the materials they use and have a go at copying one of their pieces Create: Create your own piece of artwork based on your topic. How are they made? How do you work them e.g. hand puppet, finger puppet, marionette Create: Create a short story to use for your puppet show Design and make the puppet characters – Think about using different ways you could attach them together	Discuss with pupil what their talents are. Ask them what they would like to contribute.
