Year 11 Leavers




Alligators have also worked super hard with their English. Some have been creative with mark making, while others have been learning how to write

Busy Bees

This year in Busy Bees has been filled with lots of amazing moments.



English has given us so many fun topics to learn from this year, some of our best moments include acting out the story "There's a Tiger in the Garden" and using puppets and mask to recall our auditory memory of the book; and finding a dragon's nest hidden in the sensory garden and writing a non-chorological report to describe the egg and inform others how to care for a dragon correctly.

Busy Bees had an amazing time reading "Supertato", we created our own

superhero foods and came up with creative ways to defeat the villains. In Term 4 we began focusing on poems and took a big interest in the poem "Mad about Dinosaurs" during this term we went on our first school trip of the year exploring "All Things Wild" and had the best time seeing the dinosaur statues, riding the train and seeing different animals. In term 5 we had a very exciting visit from the wonderful Grandma Grace and spent the morning following the instructions we had written on how to look after a grandma. We have ended the year reading the



stories "Dear Zoo" and "Oh Dear". Using these books we have learnt what a recount was and rewritten our own visions of the stories.

In Maths we have really enjoyed our practical lessons, playing musical chairs to help us understand addition and subtraction, using weights and measuring jugs and lots of water play to measure the weight, mass and capacity of objects and liquids. We have also opened our own shop to help us un-

derstand the value of money and identify the different coins. In Term 6 we have moved on to learn about fractions, focusing on whole, half and quarter fractions.

Other highlights from this year are when Busy Bees focused on personal history looking back on big moments in their lives, such as being born, birthdays and starting school. We also created a giant "Busy Bees family tree" using logs, sticks and leaves. In PHSE we had got to experience a visit from "Little City" and explored the wonderful role-playing equipment. There was also the very successful Cattle Country trip, World book day and Sports day.



Busy Bees have worked extremely hard this year and their progress has been incredible.



Cheetahs

Wow, what an incredible year we have had in Cheetah class! We have been really busy learning lots of new concepts through a fun topic-based approach. We have extended our mathematical knowledge and been exposed to new language within various top-



ics. In English we have been developing our reading, fine motor skills, pre-writing skills, letter formation and sentence structure. Some of us have also been busy learning typing skills and thinking about how to use capital letters and full stops. Cheetahs have loved participating in learning carousals and have had the opportunity to apply their knowledge to various fun, engaging tasks whilst deepening their problem-solving skills. It has been amazing to see the progression that has been made across the year!

We have also been busy learning some key life skills during 'Our futures' lessons. We have made various items such as sandwiches, cakes, drinks and more. Alongside developing our cooking skills, we have also had the opportunity to develop our safety awareness using key equipment / tools and practised washing up too!

Our Bodies sessions have also been a particular favourite for us all. We have been participating in various physical activities to support our gross motor skills alongside playing team building games and of course having lots of fun along the way! We have been busy learning about various bodies parts and how they may feel. The best part was looking forward to our weekly experiments as this was always very exciting and supported our understanding well. Of course, we have had lots of time to develop our social and emotional skills too. We have really enjoyed building some amazing relationships with all adults and peers. We have had time to practise our turn taking and sharing skills alongside scaffold our communication and interactions too.

We have been extremely lucky to have attended two incredible trips this year; Perrygrove Railway and Cattle Country. In addition to these, we also had visitors to school; 'Tatty Bumpkin' and 'The music works'. These were fantastic experiences which the whole class enjoyed thoroughly. We ended the year with a particular highlight; Swimming! We all looked forward to our weekly session and learnt some new skills alongside having endless fun in the water! The Cheetah team have been extremely proud of incredible behaviour and listening skills throughout these activities. It has been a fantastic year and we wish the Cheetah's all the best in their next adventure!

Relax kids sessions have further helped the children to recognise their body signals and learn different yoga poses and story massage.

Other highlights of the year have been our International days and special celebrations such as Harvest, Christmas and Easter ser-



vices, where they worked together as a class to create artwork and practise and perform some fantastic songs and dances! The children have also showed their creative skills when they designed and made tea party hats and pizza boxes in preparation for their own tea party and pizza making! Fortunately, after a term of instruction writing, they were able to make the perfect cup of tea and pizza! Dolphin class really loved it when Little City came to school, giving children the opportunity to experience a range of different jobs through this role play experience. 
In Term 4, we loved exploring maps and using our knowledge

Term 6 has been a busy term too! We have enjoyed a trip to the cinema and swimming. In maths, we loved getting wet learning about capacity and exploring our senses.


















Belmonts Got Talent 2024

All of the children have made great progress with their learning both in the classroom and outdoors. Some examples of what we have learnt this year in English include writing different types of poems and writing instructions....which led to some questionable jam sandwich making (a valuable lesson in making sure our instructions are detailed and clear!). We have also looked at recounts including writing a newspaper article based on the book we have been reading together (The Explorer) and using the past tense. In maths we have covered topics and developed our skills in looking at the four operations, shape, fractions, telling the time, money, mass and capacity. Other learning has included topics of knights and castles including making our own tower using clay and learning about volcanoes and making our own 'active' volcanoes using papier-mâché. We have also learnt about forces and motion and our senses and materials.

We have enjoyed being outdoors throughout this year. We have planted and grown seeds and plants, gone on bug hunts and built dens and fires.
